

JUNIOR FAIR ROYALTY

Rules for selection

1. Any boy or girl 16 to 18 years old as of January 1, the current year is eligible to be a candidate. The candidate must be a current member and representing one of the following organizations: 4-H, FFA, FCCLA, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, Camp Fire Boys & Girls, or Junior Achievement. (Riverdale School District: only those who are residents of Hancock County and a current member in one of the above Hancock County organizations).
2. Each applicant is to submit a current picture with their completed application form. Applications may be secured from the Junior Fair Office or Senior Fair Office.
3. Two (2) letters of recommendation must be included with the application. Recommendations cannot be written by relatives and/or family members.
4. Applications, recommendations and current picture must be received at the **Junior Fair Office** no later than Monday August 8, 2022 5:00 p.m. **NO APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THIS DEADLINE.**
5. An interview session will be held with a panel of judges for the selection of King, Queen, Prince, and Princess. (Information will be mailed to each applicant regarding day, starting time and location of interviews.
6. The Hancock County Junior Fair Royal Court will consist of: King, Queen, Prince, and Princess.
7. Coronation Ceremonies: Tuesday evening, before the Hancock County Fair.
8. The King, Queen, Prince, and Princess **MUST BE PRESENT** to preside over the remaining days of the Fair and be present at Judging, Contests, and Jr. Fair Livestock Sale throughout the fair.

 2. Arrangements to be made with the Superintendent no later than August 1, current year.
 3. Booths in Youth Building are not available to FFA, FCS, IA, ART, or other school related organizations. These are represented in the Education Building.
 4. All booths should follow Jr. Fair Theme. Booths must follow the Jr Fair theme to be considered for awards.
 5. The updated list of fire rules and regulations will be posted on the Fair website and Hancock.osu.edu.
 6. Exhibitor to receive **premium for only projects exhibited. If removal is necessary, no premiums will be received.**
 7. Crop & Vegetable projects displayed in booth at the discretion of club advisor, a poster is acceptable

 9. All Junior Fair Exhibits must be in place by 6:00 p.m. the Monday, prior to opening of the fair to receive premium.

 - a. Best Use of Theme
 - b. Most Creative
 - c. Best Display of Projects, Organization & Planning
 - d. Best Explanation of Club Work
 - e. Best Use of Motion / Movement
 - f. Peoples Choice voted Wednesday & Thursday - announced Friday
 12. There will be one award for each category for both small and large booths.
 13. The Findlay Fire Marshall comes and inspects all the booths. Anything he deems unsafe must be removed. You **MUST** use heavy duty extension cords, and the new LED light bulbs
