01 Cross Breed Dairy Feeders

General Rules:

- Calves must weigh between 350# and 699# at the fair.
- The Calves shall be in possession of the Junior Fair Exhibitor no later than the May 1st
- Weigh-In Tuesday prior to fair, following Hancock County Dairy Feeders.
- Dairy Feeders are to be dehorn and surgically castrated before June 1st of current year.
- Dairy Feeders must be a Dairy Beef Cross. dehorned and Castrated steers
- Mandatory tagging, Vaccination and weigh- in of dairy feeders will take place on June 8th from 6-8pm.
- Show Sticks are Required
- Each exhibitor must show and be responsible for his or her animal unless excused by the superintendents for sickness or other justifiable reason. Animals must be halter broke.
- Exhibitors are required to perform hands on grooming on their own animals [refer to general rules for livestock, section 2.11
- No household fans, must have 3 pronged plug. Industrial grade only.
- If superintendent determines an animal requires veterinary care, it will be administer at EXHIBITOR'S EXPENSE.
- Classes for show will be determined by weight at the discretion of the sale committee and superintendents.
- Exhibitors must abide by the Jr. Fair Rules and Regulations, Codes of Practice, Code of Ethics, and Tampering/ Misrepresentation Rules. Dehydration and re-hydration with the use of any form of electrolytes is prohibited.
- Any and all tampering will be determined by the department superintendent. The Exhibitor may be asked to remove animal from the fairgrounds.
- 'Drug Use Notification Form' must be completed for all Jr. Fair Animals and turned in prior to weigh in. DUNF "withdrawal by date" will be Monday 12 midnight prior to the fair. All Animals must be drug free before weighing.
- A Grand Champion & Reserve Champion will be chosen, but will not sell in the Sale of Champions on Labor Day.
- All Cross Breed Dairy Feeders must go Base Bid. No Cross Breed Dairy Feeders will be sold in Monday Sale Ring.
- Exhibitors can Exhibit in BOTH Hancock County Dairy Feeder program with pure breed cattle [see HCDF rules] and Cross Breed Cattle Division. Limit two per exhibitor per class.

Dairy Feeder Cross Breed Showmanship

- 1. All Caves will be shown as beef animals
- 2. Show Sticks are required
- 3. Animal and exhibitor must be clean and presentable.
- 4. Natural hair flow, no unnatural grooming or placement of hair
- 5. Trimming only of head, top-line, underline and tail.
- 6. Dairy Feeder Cross Breed Showmanship Senior Class winner Not eligible for Showman to Showman Competition
- 7. Showmanship to start classes
 Age of exhibitor determined as of Jan. 1, Current year.
 Senior Showmanship- 14 years and old
 Intermediate Showmanship- 11yrs. to 13 yrs.
 Junior Showmanship- 8yrs. to 10 yrs.
 Super Showmanship- Previous winners
 Winners in Showmanship Class may not compete in that class the following year, but may compete in previous winners' class.

Dairy Feeder Cross Breed Base Bid Auction and sale Rules

- 1. Dairy Feeders will be sold individually.
- 2. Calves less than 350# or greater than 699# will be allowed to show on Show Day in the under/ over class but will not be eligible for the championship drive, project donations or to be taken thru the premium sale.
- 3. All Calves will be sold to base bidders at an awarded base bid price. There will be no take-home bids on sale day for any
- 4. Anyone is welcome to participate in the Base Bid Auction held on Saturday morning at 10am. Location- Recker Arena
- 5. ALL Cross Breed Calves will leave Saturday.
