General Rules: NO ENTRY FEE, NO PREMIUMS

- 1. Entries are open to the public and you do not have to be a Hancock Co. resident to participate but you must purchase entry into the fair or present your fair pass.
- 2. Entries are to be accepted from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. the day of the show & 4-5:30 Thursday August 29. Judging will commence at 12 p.m.
- 3. Exhibitor should complete the entry form and each entry must be tagged and named.
- 4. Entries should be grown by the exhibitor except for those items necessary to enhance the arrangements. An exhibitor may make as many entries as desired in any class, providing each is a different named variety and color. All Arrangements must list on 3x5 note card name of flowers and materials used.
- 5. Clear Glass Containers can be provided by the entrant. Flower dept. Has small containers available.
- 6. Judging decisions are final.
- 7. Exhibits released at 12 (Noon), Monday (Labor Day).

Dahlia Single Bloom

Entries accepted from 9:00 – 11:00 a.m. Friday & Thursday August 29. 4-5:30 at Grange Building;

Judging at 12 Noon

Exhibit to be disbudded and shown with at least one pair of leaves above the container which is provided. Bloom displayed no more than 12" above the container. Must be named.

Division 281 – Marigolds

02 2" to 3", 3 stems, same color and variety

under 2", 3 stems, same color and variety

Division 282 – Zinnias

1 bloom, less than 2" diameter

1 bloom, 2" - 4" diameter; Red, Pink, Orange

1 bloom, 2" - 4" diameter; White, Yellow, Light Green

1 bloom, over 4" diameter

Division 283 - Celosia

Class

on crested (cockcomb) type, 1 flower head, side branches permitted

o2 plumed or feather type, 1 flower head, side branches permitted

Division 284 - Gladiolus (500, 400, 300)

Each must be cut to a length <20 inches from bottom floret down to prevent them falling down. Side shoots must be removed although foliage should be left on. Marks permitted.

- **01** white, yellow, or cream 1 spike
- orange, salmon, pink 1 spike
- red, scarlet, purple, violet, lavender 1 spike
- **04** any color not in above classes
- os small (200) or miniature (100) size, any color or variety, stem length <19" and <17" respectively 1 spike

Division 285 - Herbs - Culinary or Decorative

Division 286 - Snapdragons, any variety named

- **02** Three same sized spikes any variety or colors named

<u>Division 287 - Round, Spike, or Spray Forms</u>

Round, spike, or spray forms not listed above. Must be named. Annual, biannual, or perennial.

Class

- **01** Any Round Form, one bloom, any variety, named, disbudded, foliage attached. Examples: daises, carnation, echinacea, gerbera daisy
- **O2** Any Spike Form, one spike, any variety, named, foliage attached. Examples: hollyhocks, hosta flowers, foxglove
- Any Spray Form, one spike, any variety, named, not disbudded, foliage attached. Examples: Hydrangea, euphorbia, astilbe

Division 288 - Potted Plant

Mature Exhibits Only.

Pot not to exceed 12" in side dimension diameter.

- **01** Succulent miniature named, one variety. Contain <6".
- **02** Succulent. Named, one large variety.
- **03** Blooming Container plants. Single variety, named.
- **04** Any unusual plant. Ex. Pineapple or Ice Plant

<u>Division 289 - Junior Artistic Floral Arrangement Division</u>

Entries accepted from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. & Thursday August 29. 4-5:30 at Grange Building on Friday. Judging at 12 noon. Entries may contain fresh or dried flowers and materials. Painted or artificially colored fresh materials are not permitted. All arrangements must have dimensions <15" tall, <20" wide and <20" deep.

Division 290 - Table Settings

All entries to include 2 place settings. Table cloth maybe neutral, bright colored, or patterned. Fine quality earthen ware maybe used. Crystal or stemware wessels, candlesticks, candelabra maybe used. Flame (not to be lit) to be at guest eye level. Live flowers must be display. Tables will be provided with 2'x3' are for each entry.

General Rules

- 1. Exhibits must be in place by 9:00 a.m. the first day of the fair and remain until closing time (12:00 p.m.) Monday, the last day of the fair.
- 2. Space in the center section of the Grange Building has been allotted for Garden Club displays. The Flower Superintendent shall assign spaces to the participating Garden Clubs.

- 3. Each Club is to be responsible to keep assigned area well filled with fresh flowers as needed daily to give a pleasing effect. (No silk flowers)
- 4. It is recommended that each single specimen shall be identified with the name of the specific variety if it be known and mounted on a standard 2" x 3" card.
- 5. Each Club Exhibit on the Pyramid shall consist of the following:
- 6. Single specimens. The number to be decided by Garden Club President.
- 7. Optional arrangements of driftwood and dry material may be used and limited to 5-6 arrangements.
- 8. Miniatures may be used in the display.
- 9. The Fair agrees to provide an attractive display area. Each participating club will receive a premium of \$125.00.
- 10. Removal of any Exhibit without approval, prior to normal release time, will result in forfeiture of Premiums.
- 11. Garden clubs will be reviewed by OAGC judge on Friday after other judging is completed Comment sheets will be provided.

Flower Arranging Competition with 3 experienced competitors will start at 2:30pm after the 12 noon Friday judging. Public invited to watch and vote. Auction of arrangement following voting, funds raised will benefit the Grange building.

Sr. Artistic Floral Arrangements

Entries accepted from 9:00 – 11:00 a.m. & Thursday August 29. 4-5:30 at Grange Building; Judging at 12 Noon

Arrangements must have dimensions <25" tall, <25" wide, <20 " deep. They may contain fresh or dried flowers and materials. No tinted or painted flowers may be used. Materials used to be listed on 3x5 note card. Flowers must be named.
