

Guys and Gals Lead Show

1. The purpose of this show is to present a class of sheep in the most attractive manner and to acquaint the public with modern sheep and wool production.
2. Sheep should be represented as a show animal; however, it may be a market lamb, ram, or ewe, and need not be a Junior Fair exhibitor's animal. (Check classes below.)
3. The entrant will be judged on his or her outfit and appearance, which must be appropriate, attractive and lend elegance to the class. The decision of the Judges is final.
4. For all classes besides decorative class participant's outfits must be predominately made of wool. Outfits may be either handmade or bought and may be entered in only one (1) class.
5. Entrant must be either a resident of Hancock County, or reside in Hancock County school district, or have a family member residing in Hancock County.
6. Only one entry per entrant may be made.

JUDGING STANDARDS:

ENTRANT'S ATTIRE: 25%

ENTRANT'S ANIMAL: 25%

ENTRANT'S POISE AND APPEARANCE 50%

7. Entry forms must be returned to the **Junior Fair Office** by 3:00pm on Saturday, the day before the show
8. Classes may be adjusted by Superintendents to balance the number of participants in each class.

DIVISION I - Junior Division

CLASS NO. 1010 – 13 years of age and under

CLASS NO. 1020 – 14 years of age and up to Jr. Fair age

DIVISION II – SEW WITH WOOL

CLASS NO. 1050 – 13 years of age and under

CLASS NO. 1055 – 14 years of age and up to Jr. Fair age

Qualifications:

- a) Participants must have made a predominately wool garment for a current year Jr. Fair project
- b) Participant must locate a sheep lead but need not own or have trained the sheep being lead.

DIVISION III – KIDDIES DIVISION - classes will be split based on age in order to keep class sizes small

CLASS NO. 1080A – Child 5 yrs. & under with sheep

CLASS NO. 1085B – Child 6-8 yrs. with sheep

CLASS NO. 1090C – Decorative/Costume Class- Child 8 yrs. & under **(does not need to be made of wool)**

CLASS NO. 1095D – Pairs: Two Children 8 yrs. & under with one lamb

Qualifications: Any child 8 yrs. old and under may enter this division
